## **Proportions**



### **Medium build type dog**

The length of the body is slightly more than the height at the withers, the height of the withers is the same height as the height of the top of the rump, the height of the elbow is 5/9 of the height of the withers. The chest is oval in shape going down to the elbows. The top line is level

Square construction:
The poodle is not a 'cob' type dog.
This should be penalised

## **Sizes**

#### STANDARD:

Between 45cm and 60cm, with an upper tolerance of 2cm.

The standard poodle should be a larger version of the medium poodle whilst maintaining the same characteristics.

**Over 62cms: Disqualified** 

#### MEDIUM:

Between 35cm and 45cms. (Do not favour the large miniature poodles).

## **Sizes**

MINIATURE: between 28cm and 35cms.

The miniature poodle should look like a smaller version of the medium poodle, keeping the same proportions as much as possible and not having any signs of 'miniaturisation'.

• TOY: Between 24cm (tolerance of 1cm less) and 28cms (the ideal is 25cms).

The toy poodle should look very much like a miniature poodle and the proportions should be the same as for the breed standard.

No signs of 'miniaturisation' should be accepted, only the occipital crest may be a little less pronounced.

**Under 23cms: Disqualified.** 

## Top line

 The back is short.
 The top line is smooth and held well.







## **SHOULDERS**

The shoulders are slanting.
The length of the humerus is

## **HEAD**



General appearance: Elegant, rectangular in shape/lines, in proportion to the body.

The head should be well chiselled, not heavy but also not too fine.

A typical expressive head.

## The head: Proportions and shape



The length of the muzzle is about 9/10 of the skull.

The width of the skull is less than half the length of the head.

The occiput ridge is very pronounced (may be slightly less so for the miniature poodle)





# The movement of the poodle



## **Typical Movement**






## The poodle has a light bouncy airy gait

At a trot the two legs that are diagonally opposite move one after the other (front left/back right then front right and back left)

## **Coat texture**

 Curly coat: profuse, texture of fine wool, very curly, elastic and resistant to the pressure of the hand.

It must be thick; there should be lots of it, a uniform length, forming uniform curls.

Faults: hair that is thinning, soft or wiry. No awarding of Excellent

## **Coat texture**



**Corded hair** abundant, texture of fine wool, tight, forming individual cords that must be at least 20cm long.



# Poodle colours (uniform)

Uniform colour all over.

5 colours: black, white, brown, grey, fawn.

Serious faults for all colours – indeterminate or uneven colour. NO EXCELLENT TO BE AWARDED.

Some tolerance for young grey and fawn dogs whose colour isn't yet fully developed.


#### **FAULTS LEADING TO ELIMINATION**



## **PIGMENTATION**

- Skin: supple, not loose, with pigment.
- Poodles who are black, brown or fawn should have a skin pigment which matches their coat colour.
- White poodles should ideally have a silvery skin pigment

### **PIGMENTATION**





Lips, nose, lips, gums, palate, natural orifices, scrotum and pads of the feet should all have pigmentation.

### **Pigmentation faults**

Nose partially without pigmentation MAXIMUM VERY GOOD



## Colours: Disqualifying faults

#### SOLID COLOURS

Any white marking on body and/or legs for all subjects other than white ones

#### OTHER COLOURS

Dogs with coat of one colour, with a single isolated mark (mismarking)

Lack of harmony in the distribution of colours on the head

White patch surrounding the eye (pirate marking) Whit patch surrounding both eyes

### Not colour for puppies

- In France when you have some not correct puppies in a litter they do not receive pedigree
- For example

Fawn puppy with other solid colour parents = no pedigree for the puppy
Other colour puppy with solid colour parents = no pedigree for the puppy
Solid colour puppy with other colour parents = no pedigree for the puppy

- Matings between basic colours (white black brown).
- Matings between these basic colours are no longer subject to requests for authorization.
- The french poodle club allows these matings for all sizes.
- Concerning matings with white, the CCF committee has some reserves.
- White Poodles with Locus C allele (like the Westie): there is no problem.
- However for white Poodles which are genetically **swsw**, i.e. homozygote for invasive spotting, it is probable that mating with black Poodles would result in harlequin puppies.
- We therefore encourage those breeders who wish to mate a white Poodle with a black Poodle to
  identify the genetic type of white and only proceed with the mating if the white is Locus C allele.
- The CCPCE considers that the mating of brown with white is of no interest whatsoever and strongly advises against it.
- However, the mating of black with brown could contribute positively to improve certain points. It is thus an interesting possibility but which should, by no means, become a habit.

- These comments are given to enlighten breeders but we can never prevent some breeders from playing « apprentice magician » or from just using the stud closest to their home. This is not what we consider as « selection ».
- We have given precise instructions to our judges, to sanction all false colours in the following three colours: black, brown and white. There could be some specimens considered as black but having, in reality, a bluish hue which can be verified by checking the skin pigmentation.

- Matings between the basic colours (Black White Brown) and diluted colours (Fawn Grey).
- These matings are not authorized by the french poodle club.
- Matings between fawn and black.
  - Very pale coloured fawns are probably diluted. If they are dd, a mating with a black will give blue (not allowed in Poodles). If they are cchcch, there is no problem with a black. Such a mating may be considered but only after submitting a request to the Club's breeding commission and then to the SCC.
  - Moreover, the « champagne » specimens could be either strongly diluted fawn or false white.
  - Thus, the french poodle club is against these matings between fawn and black. There
    again it is a question of breeding policy in France and, like always, other countries can
    do as they wish. Again we wish to warn the « apprentice magicians » who play with
    mixing colours without knowing the genetics of their breeding stock.

- Matings between fawn and grey.
- The french poodle club does not authorize such matings.
- Matings between other-coloured Poodles with basic colours and/or diluted colours.
- Such matings are not authorized in the Standard by the french poodle club.
- If such a mating may be considered by a breeder, the latter must submit a request for authorization accompanied by a complete folder explaining the motivation for such a project; the request shall be studied by the Club's Breeding Commission and then submitted to the SCC Scientific Commission for a decision.
- Blue Poodles.
- As was stated during our meeting, a blue dog always has a blue nose point confirmed by Prof. Denis in his book on colours in dogs.
- The other colours, called « blue », are in reality a variation of other colours which explains why they do not have a blue nose. We therefore confirm that a blue Poodle is not authorized. Other colours which you may refer to as « blue » are bad colours.


## **Traditional Show Groomings**

 The judging of a show poodle is not in any way judging a grooming contest. Over the top trims are to be discouraged. Whatever the trim it should not in any way influence the judging and ranking of the dogs.

As stated in the FCI regulations, products that could change the texture or colour of the coat are not allowed.


Poodles who do not have a traditional trim cannot be judged but this does not stop them being used for breeding





## **Serious faults**

- Eyes too big and round, sunken, not dark enough
- Ears too short (not reaching the corners of the mouth)
- Snipey or pointed muzzle
- Convex muzzle
- Roach or sway back
- Tail set on too low
- Croup falling away
- Rear angulations too straight or over-angulted
- Flowing or extendend gait
- Sparse, soft or wire hair
- Subjects with solid coloured coat : undefined or not solid colour
- Partially depigmented nose
- Absence of 2 PM2

NO CAC-CACIB, MAXIMUM AWARD IS VERY GOOD

# Faults leading to Elimination

- Aggressive or overly shy dogs
- Any dog clearly showing any obvious physical or behavioural problems will be disqualified
- Lack of type and particulary in head, hinting notably at a mixture with another bredbreed
- Height exceeding 62 cm in Standard and less than 23 cm in Toys
- Absence of tail or naturally short tail
- Dewclaws or evidence of dewclaws on rear limbs.
- Any subjected displaying signs of dwardism: globulus skull, adsence of occipital protuberance, very pronounced stop, proeminent eyes, muzzle too short and turned up
- Median furrow practically inesxistant
- Very light bone in Toys
- Tail completely curled
- For dogs with solid colour: any white marking on body and/for legs for all subjects other than the white ones.
- For dogs of another colour
  - Dog with coat of one colour, with a single isolated mark (mismarking)
  - Lack of harmony in the distribution of colours on the head
  - White patch surrounding the eye (pirate marking)
  - White patch surrounding both eyes.
- Nose completely depigmented
- Underbite or overbite
- Every tooth position which could injure the dog (for instance : all-positioned canine thaht touches the palate)
- Absence of 1 incisor or 1 canine or 1 carnassial
- Absence of 1 PM3 or of 1 PM4
- Absence of three or more PM (except PM1)
